# The Heartbleed Bug

---

- ❖ “Catastrophically bad” bug discovered last week in the central security protocol used by millions of Internet servers
- ❖ Far worse than the Apple “Goto Fail” security bug earlier this year
- ❖ Allows an attacker to scoop up large chunks of a server’s internal memory from what should be an secure, encrypted connection

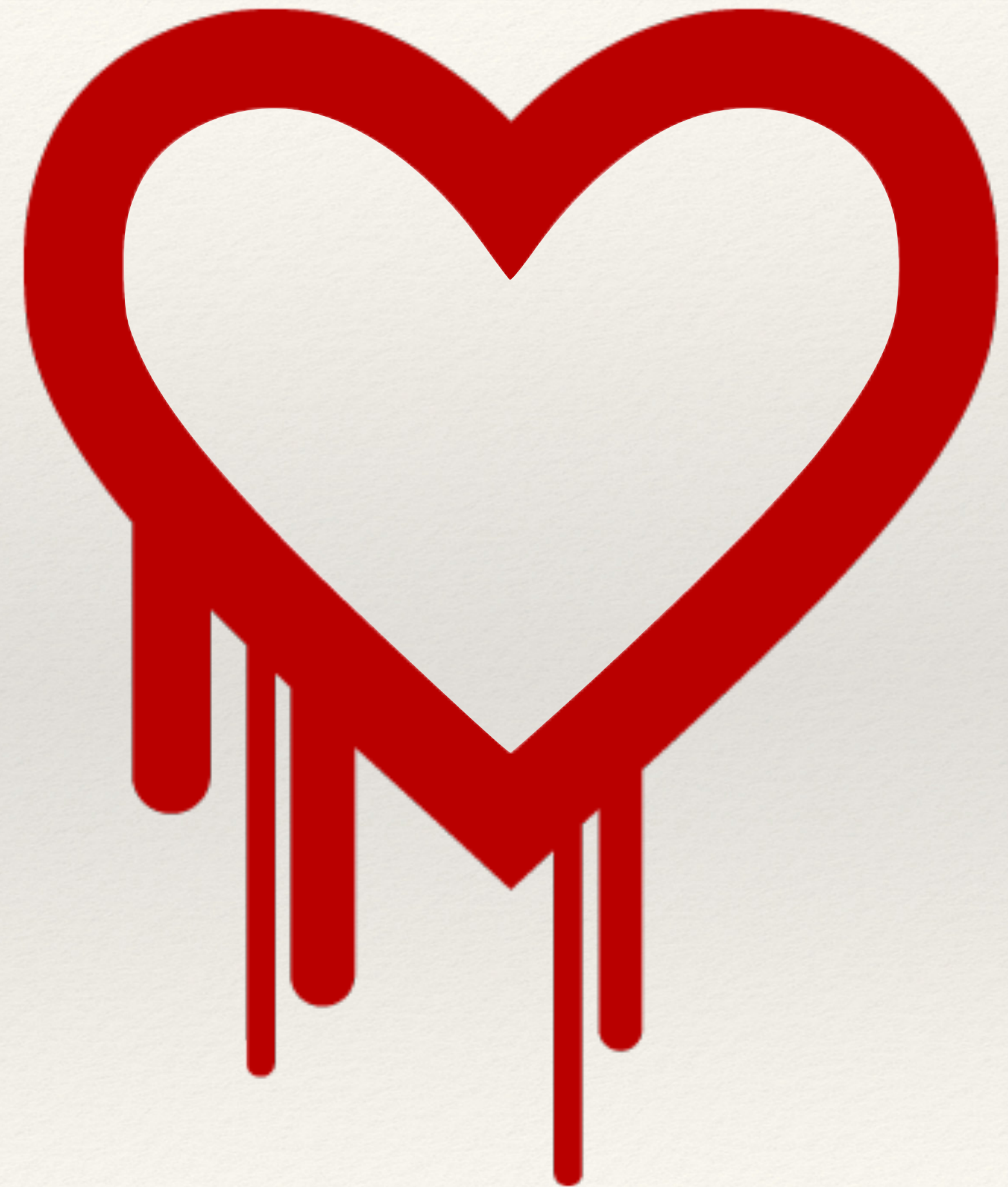




# The Heartbleed Bug: What's Happening

- ❖ Large Web operators patching their servers already
- ❖ Many millions of servers need to be patched to close the vulnerability
- ❖ Could take many years for all affected servers to be patched
- ❖ Apple, Google, Microsoft appear to be *unaffected*

# The Heartbleed Bug: What You Can Do

- ❖ Follow best practices:
  - ❖ Use long, strong, unique passwords for every site, managed by a trusted password manager like 1Password
  - ❖ Monitor your online accounts regularly for any unusual activity
  - ❖ Do not store credit card info with any sites unless required (i.e., Sunpass, Netflix)

# Lock Down Your Mac

---



- ❖ Secure your Mac laptop or desktop to prevent data theft and aid in recovery in case of loss or theft
- ❖ A must for all Mac laptops; a heck of a good idea for Mac desktops
- ❖ Simple and quick to do — set it up once and then sleep better every night



# Possible Attack Vectors



- ❖ If a bad guy gets physical access to your Mac, they could:
  - ❖ Boot it up
  - ❖ Exfiltrate your data
  - ❖ Erase your data
  - ❖ Wipe your machine and re-sell it as used



---

# Apple Has Thought of All of This

---

- ❖ Your Mac's hardware and OS have many layers of security built-in, but most of them are *turned off* by default
- ❖ They include:
  - ❖ Boot-up password: first level data security
  - ❖ FileVault: baked-in whole-disk encryption
  - ❖ Firmware password: prevents a bad guy from using the OS X Recovery Partition to gain access
  - ❖ Time Machine: continuous file backup to external HD
  - ❖ Find My Mac: theft recovery telemetry via iCloud

# Handout: The Extra Steps

## Lock Down Your Mac

You can take some quick, easy steps to help protect your Mac in case of physical theft and to aid in its recovery if it is lost or stolen.

These procedures are a must for any portable Mac (MacBook Air or MacBook Pro), and are strongly recommended for Mac desktops as well (iMac, Mac mini and Mac Pro).

### Enable boot-up and sleep/wake password:

1. On your Mac, click the Apple menu and choose System Preferences
2. Click the Security & Privacy pane, then click the General tab
3. Click the little padlock icon at the lower left corner of the General pane and enter your Mac's admin password., then click Unlock This is the password you must sometimes enter when updating or installing software.
4. Tick the checkbox for "Disable automatic login." This requires you to enter your Mac's admin password whenever your Mac boots up.
5. Tick the checkbox for "Show a message when the screen is unlocked."
6. Click the "Set Lock Message..." button.
7. In the dialog box, enter your name on the first line followed by "REWARD FOR RETURN." Hold down the Option key and press Enter to start a new line, then enter your contact phone number and email address.
8. Click OK to close the Set Lock Message dialog box.
9. Tick the checkbox for "Require password..." and choose "immediately" from the pop-up list for "after sleep or screen saver begins."
10. Click the little padlock icon at the lower left corner of the General pane to lock in your new settings.

**Make sure to keep a secure, replicated, encrypted, off-site, backed-up copy of your Mac's admin password.** Ideally, this will be kept in a Secure Note inside the IPassword app on your Mac, iPhone or iPad.

If you lose this password, it will be very difficult to regain access to your Mac, to install or update new software, or to make some System Preference settings changes, so keep this password safe and secure and backed-up somewhere *OTHER* than on your Mac.

### Enable Find My Mac

Apple's iCloud service can help you locate your Mac if it is lost or stolen. The iCloud service Find My Mac uses geolocation and remote telemetry over the Internet to help you or law enforcement personnel find your Mac if it is stolen, so long as it is able to connect to a Wi-Fi network.

To enable Find My Mac:

1. On your Mac, click the Apple menu and choose System Preferences
2. Click the iCloud pane. If you don't already have an iCloud account, follow the prompts to create a new iCloud account along with an iCloud email address. Be sure to use a strong, long, unique password for your iCloud account, and memorize it.
3. In the iCloud preferences, scroll down to Find My Mac.

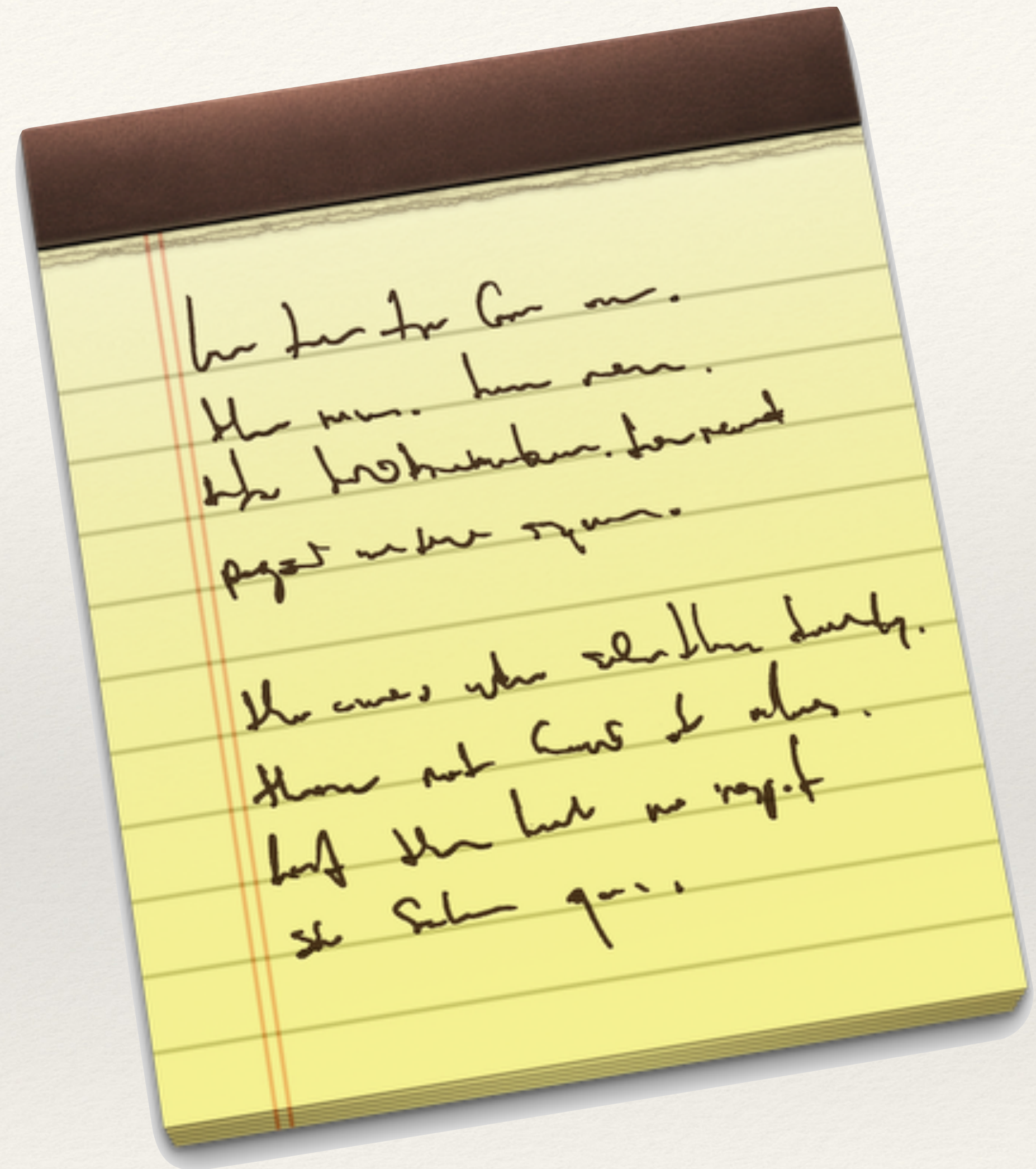

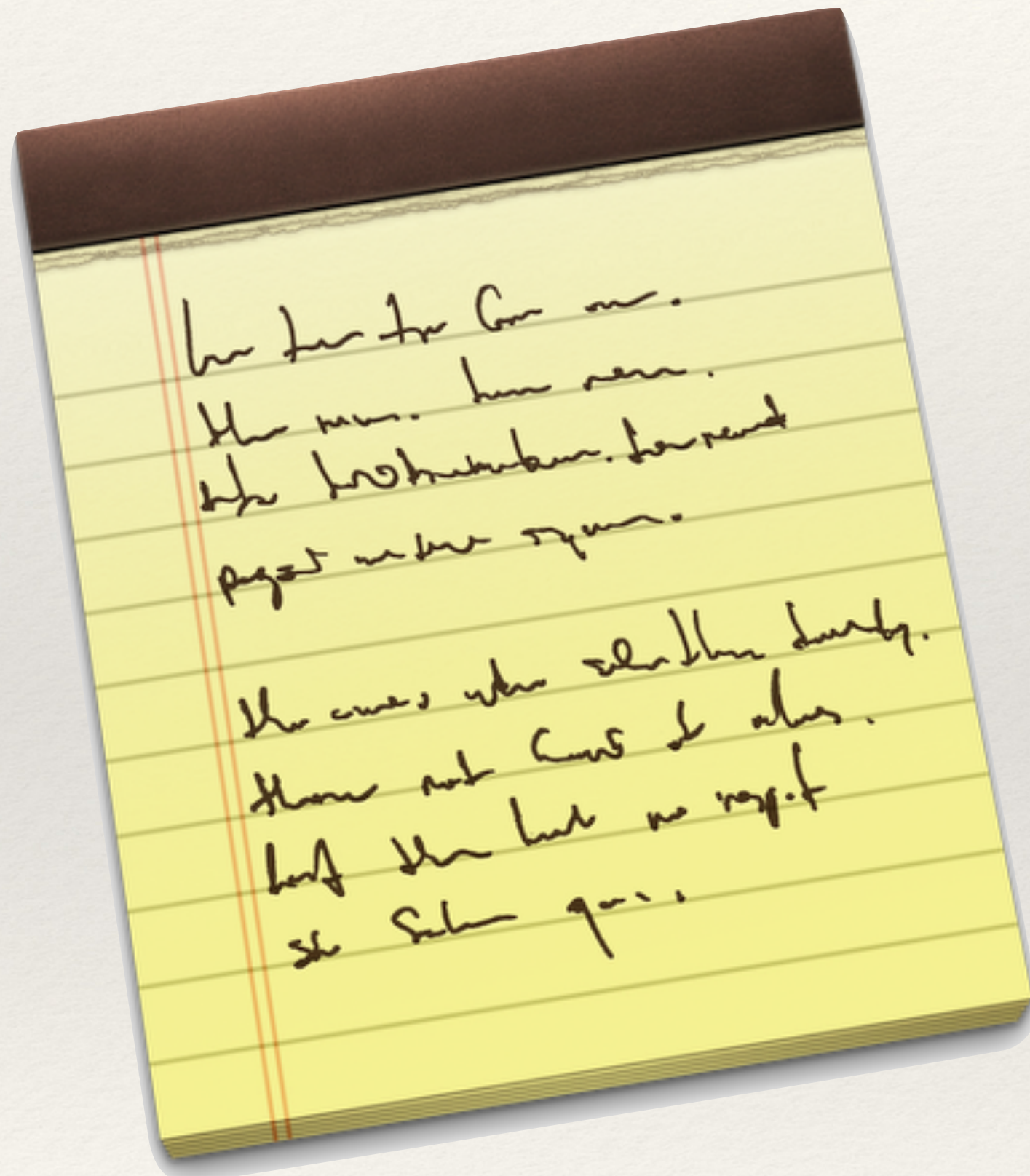

# Stephen Wolfram

---



- ❖ *b. London, 1959*; attended Eton, Oxford and CalTech; first published paper at age 15; Ph.D. from CalTech at 20.
- ❖ Early scientific work was in high-energy physics, quantum field theory, and cosmology, included several breakthrough results.
- ❖ Youngest-ever recipient of the MacArthur Fellowship “Genius” award, at 22.
- ❖ Migrated to computer science in early 1980’s; released *Mathematica* software in 1988.
- ❖ Authored a huge and controversial 1,200-page book in 2002, *A New Kind of Science*.



# Wolfram Alpha

- ❖ “A compute engine for structured knowledge.”
- ❖ Vast, continuously-update database of facts & information in over 1,000 domains of knowledge.
- ❖ Not a search engine, but a natural-language answer engine for nearly anything that is computable.
- ❖ Powers many of the features of Apple’s Siri.

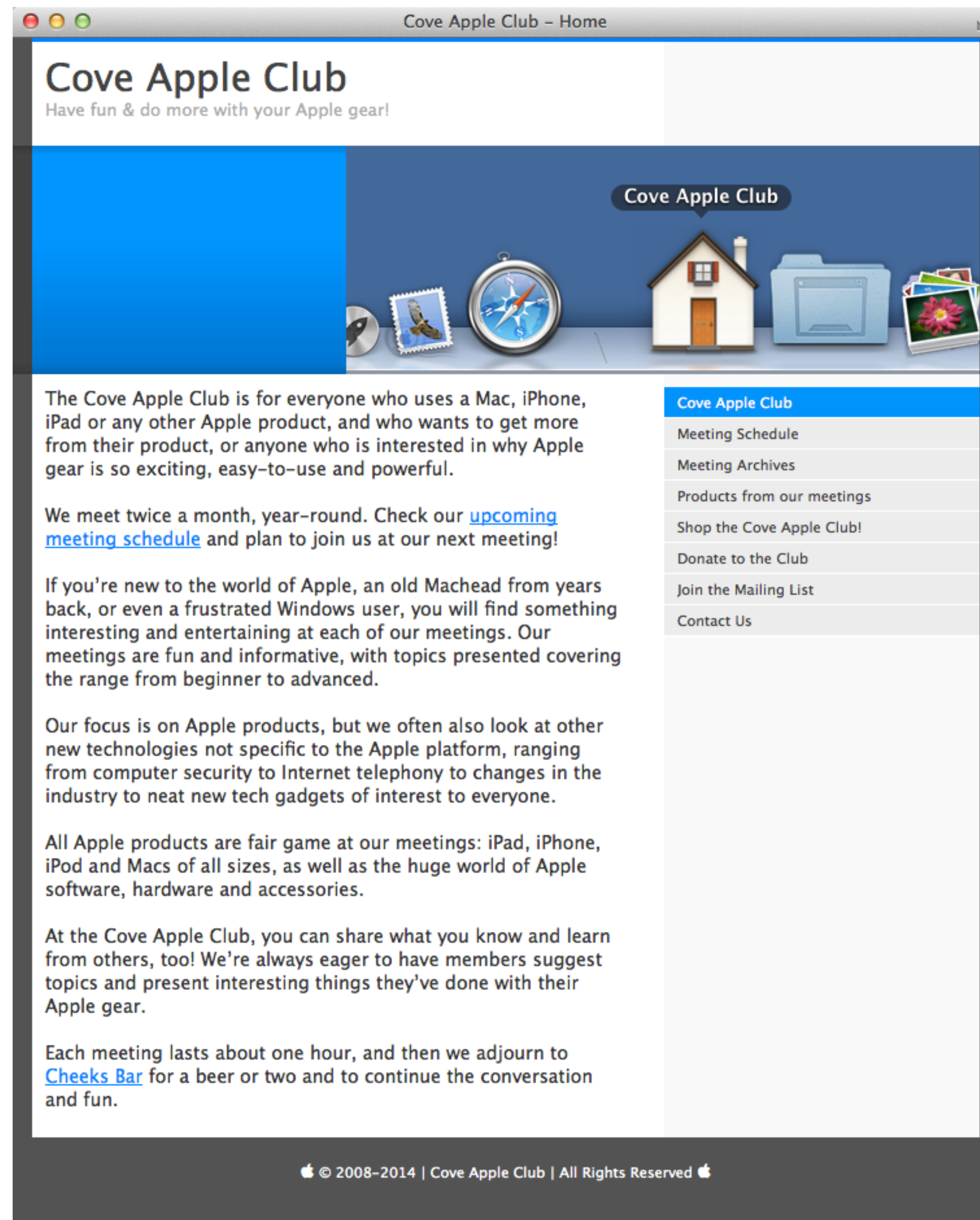

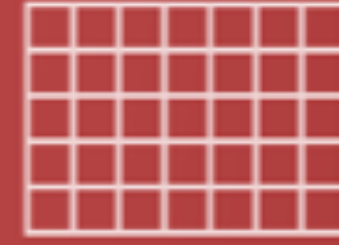
