




This is not a case about one isolated iPhone. Rather, this case is about the Department of Justice and the FBI seeking through the courts a dangerous power that Congress and the American people have withheld: the ability to force companies like Apple to undermine the basic security and privacy interests of hundreds of millions of individuals around the globe. The government demands that Apple create a back door to defeat the encryption on the iPhone, making its users' most confidential and personal information vulnerable to hackers, identity thieves, hostile foreign agents, and unwarranted government surveillance. The All Writs Act, first enacted in 1789 and on which the government bases its entire case, "does not give the district court a roving commission" to conscript and commandeer Apple in this manner. Plum Creek Lumber Co. v. Hutton, 608 F.2d 1283, 1289 (9th Cir. 1979). In fact, no court has ever authorized what the government now seeks, no law supports such unlimited and sweeping use of the judicial process, and the Constitution forbids it.

What does the NSA spend \$60-billion a year on if they can't crack open an iPhone?

CLARKE: Every expert I know believes that NSA could crack this phone. They want the precedent that the government can compel a computer device manufacturer to allow the government in.

A Message to Our Customers

The United States government has demanded that Apple take an unprecedented step which threatens the security of our customers. We oppose this order, which has implications far beyond the legal case at hand.

This moment calls for public discussion, and we want our customers and people around the country to understand what is at stake.

Answers to your questions about privacy and security

The Need for Encryption

Smartphones, led by iPhone, have become an essential part of our lives. People use them to store an incredible amount of personal information, from our private conversations to our photos, our music, our notes, our calendars and contacts, our financial information and health data, even where we have been and where we are going.

All that information needs to be protected from hackers and criminals who want to access it, steal it, and use it without our knowledge or permission. Customers expect Apple and other technology companies to do everything in our power to protect their personal information, and at Apple we are deeply committed to safeguarding their data.

Compromising the security of our personal information can ultimately put our personal safety at risk. That is why encryption has become so important to all of us.

For many years, we have used encryption to protect our customers' personal data because we believe it's the only way to keep their information safe. We have even put that data out of our own reach, because we believe the contents of your iPhone are none of our business.

The San Bernardino Case

We were shocked and outraged by the deadly act of terrorism in San Bernardino last December. We mourn the loss of life and want justice for all those whose lives were affected. The FBI asked us for

FBI Smartphone Security Recommendations

Safety tips to protect your mobile device:

- When purchasing a smartphone, know the features of the device, including the default settings. Turn
 off features of the device not needed to minimize the attack surface of the device.
- Depending on the type of phone, the operating system may have encryption available. This can be
 used to protect the user's personal data in the case of loss or theft.
- With the growth of the application market for mobile devices, users should look at the reviews of the developer/company who published the application.
- Review and understand the permissions you are giving when you download applications.
- Passcode protect your mobile device. This is the first layer of physical security to protect the contents of the device. In conjunction with the passcode, enable the screen lock feature after a few minutes of inactivity.
- Obtain malware protection for your mobile device. Look for applications that specialize in antivirus or file integrity that helps protect your device from rogue applications and malware.




A Little Bit of a Downer

- That income also incurred a penalty




- We have to pay about \$620 in taxes on that \$2,100 in Cove Apple Club income

Making PDFs the Fun and Easy Way


Save-to-PDF Keyboard Shortcut HOWTO

Since the very first version of Mac OS X in 2000, Mac users have been able to quickly and easily create PDF documents from any app that has a Print dialog — which means, just about every app there is.

To make a PDF from an application, follow these steps:

- 2. Set your Print dialog options as desired for page range to print, paper size, page orientation, etc.
- 3. In the lower-left corner of the Print dialog, click on the PDF drop-down



- 4. Click Save as PDF..
- Select a destination for your PDF file
- 6. Select any optional encryption features for your PDF file

Many apps allow you to send PDFs directly to them, saving you a step when you want to email a PDF, save it to Evernote, send it via Messages, etc. Check out the list of additional PDF destination actions on the PDF drop-down box


And you're an enthusiastic and frequent PDF-saver, you may want to save yourself several dozen keystrokes and

mouse clicks everyday by installing Mike's custom Save-to-PDF Keyboard Shortcut. It takes just a minute to set up on your Mac, and once it's installed, it's ready to use with just a keystroke. It lets you save to PDF from any app with just two Command-key keystrokes. It's a real time-saver!

Here's how to set it up on your Mac:

- 1. From the d menu, choose System Preferences
- 2. Click Keyboard to open the Keyboard preference pane
- 3. Click the Shortcuts tab at the top
- 4. In the left-hand Sources column, click on App Shortcuts
- 5. Below the list of App Shortcuts, click the "+" symbol
- In the dialog sheet:

- 6.1. In the Menu Title field, type "Save as PDF..." note that you must type this in **EXACTLY** as shown, with **NO** SPACE between the "F" in PDF and the three periods; and with the letter casing as shown 6.2. Press Tab to move to the Keyboard Shortcut field
- 6.3. In the Keyboard Shortcut field, type the letter P while holding down the Command (Cmd) key. Refer to the



- Click Add
- 8. Quit System Preferences

That's it — a quick, one-time setup on your Mac, and now it's ready to use every day!

Now, whenever you want to create a PDF quickly from any app, just type Cmd-P twice. The first time you type Cmd-P, the app's Print Dialog will appear. When you type Cmd-P a second time, the Save to PDF... dialog will be invoked, ready

Even quicker: type Cmd-P twice, then type Cmd-D to select the Desktop as the Save destination, then press Enter. Four quick keystrokes, and you've got your PDF created and on the Desktop ready to use, email, file or whatever!
