
AAPL 2021 Year in Review

No matter what happens, always remember:

Apple is forever doomed.

Apple is doomed because:

“The Apple Watch will flop. Here’s why.”



“Here's why Apple knows the Apple Watch won't be a hit:

It costs \$350. That's a lot of money to fork over for a device that adds a slight bit of convenience. It doesn't do anything more than your iPhone does -- it just allows you to do some iPhone functions on your wrist.

Wearable devices haven't taken off for that reason: The functionality doesn't justify their price.

As serial tech investor Fred Wilson predicted earlier this year, ‘Another market where the reality will not live up to the hype is wearables. Not everyone will want to wear a computer on their wrist.’”

Meanwhile, on Earth, Apple Watch is now a \$60-billion/year business, growing 45%/year for the past three years, and does more business than the entire Swiss watch industry, which has been around for 375 years.

Meanwhile, on Earth, the Mac is on fire and is selling better than ever in its nearly four decades on the market.

The Mac product line is a \$40-billion/year business, grew 25% in 2021, and has the #1 best-selling consumer laptop, pro laptop, and consumer desktop systems in the market for the past decade-plus. The new M1 Macs are smoking anything available in the PC world, and Intel is in trouble.

Apple introduced the Macintosh *38 years ago this month.*

“The law of large numbers.”



“Here is the rub: Apple is so big, it’s running up against the law of large numbers.

If Apple’s share price grew even 20 percent a year for the next decade, which is far *below* its current blistering pace, *its \$500 billion market capitalization would be more than \$3 trillion by 2022.* That is bigger than the 2011 gross domestic product of France or Brazil.”

Apple's “slow, then sudden” rise to \$3T

- AAPL took 42 years to rise to \$1T, in 2018
- AAPL took 2 years to rise to \$2T, in 2020
- AAPL took 17 months to rise to \$3T, on Monday
- With a \$3,000,000,000,000 market value, Apple is worth more today than Walmart, Disney, Netflix, Nike, Exxon Mobil, Coca-Cola, McDonald's, AT&T, Goldman Sachs, Boeing, IBM and Ford *combined*


Apple had a good 2021

Fiscal year ended September 25, 2021

- Revenue grew 33%, to \$365,817,000,000 for FY21
- Gross margin grew 45.6%, to \$152,836,000,000 for FY21
- Apple spent \$21,914,000,000 on R&D, which is 6% of sales, about 2x other large companies
- Earnings per share rose 71%, to \$5.67/share
- China revenue grew 70%; iPhone sales grew 39%; wearables grew 25%; services grew 27%; Mac grew 25%; iPad grew 34%
- ...all during a global pandemic, with stores shut and the economy in the tank




AAPL January 1 - June 30, 2021 - Up 2%

Underperforms S&P 500 by 13.5%




AAPL January 1 - September 30, 2021 - Up 6%

















Nearly everyone takes and shares screenshots on their iOS device, either their iPhone or their iPad. But lots of them do it wrong, and do it the hard way!

This little guide will get you started on making and sharing perfect screenshots on your iPhone or iPad.

Taking screenshots on iPhone

On iPhones with Face ID:

1. Press the side button (on the top left of the iPhone) and the Volume Up button at the same time.
2. Quickly release both buttons.
3. After you take a screenshot, a thumbnail temporarily appears in the lower-left corner of your screen. Tap the thumbnail to open it or swipe left to dismiss it.

On iPhones with Touch ID:

1. Press the side button (on the top left of the iPhone) and the Home button at the same time.
2. Quickly release both buttons.
3. After you take a screenshot, a thumbnail temporarily appears in the lower-left corner of your screen. Tap the thumbnail to open it or swipe left to dismiss it.

Taking screenshots on iPad

On iPads without a Home button:

1. Press the top button (Sleep/Wake button) and either Volume Up or Volume Down button at the same time.
2. Quickly release both buttons.
3. After you take a screenshot, a thumbnail temporarily appears in the lower-left corner of your screen. Tap the thumbnail to open it or swipe left to dismiss it.

On iPads with a Home button:

1. Press the top button (Sleep/Wake button) and the Home button at the same time.
2. Quickly release both buttons.
3. After you take a screenshot, a thumbnail temporarily appears in the lower-left corner of your screen. Tap the thumbnail to open it or swipe left to dismiss it.

Where to find screenshots

All your screenshots are automatically saved in the Photos app. Open Photos → Screenshots.

How to edit screenshots immediately after capture

Starting with iOS 9, you can quickly and easily edit, crop and share your screenshots in the Markup screenshot editor.

1. Immediately after you take a screenshot, a thumbnail temporarily appears in the lower-left corner of your screen. Tap the thumbnail to open it or swipe left to dismiss it.
2. To crop the screenshot (remove unwanted border areas), tap on any of the six re-sizing "handles" along the edges of the screenshot, then drag them in or out to crop. The cropped screenshot will be displayed after you make a crop.
3. To annotate, highlight, add text, insert a signature, zoom in, or add a description on your screenshot, tap the pencil icon at the top of the screenshot preview screen.
4. To share your screenshot, tap the Share icon at the top left of the screenshot preview screen.
5. When done editing your screenshot, tap Done, then choose to save your screenshot to the Photos app, save it to iCloud Files, or delete it.

To learn more about taking, editing and sharing screenshots, open the free Apple Support app on your iPhone or iPad, tap the magnifying glass icon at the top right, then type "screenshot" into the search bar, then tap Search.
